the Milton Trial Site. Despite the lack of a break, trials are in the ground and are just waiting on that autumn rain. Here are a few things we're looking forward to seeing germinate in 2024.

After a successful year in 2023, a new annual ryegrass trial was sown in early April. With a mixture of newer varieties and some old favorites, this trial will see us assess these varieties for their growth throughout the year. There will also be assessments on their germination and early plant density this year.


We will also be assessing hybrid, Italian and perennial ryegrasses that interesting chemical mixes and results from that one in winter. are in their second year. These trials were sown in 2023 and have made it through the summer. Varieties will also be assessed for their dry matter, as well as their long term plant density.

It will be interesting to see how all of these ryegrasses handle such an unusually dry start to the season. Keep an eye out for results throughout the year as we assess them for their suitability to the Coleraine region.

Much like the rest of south west Victoria, things are off to a dry start at You can also see a similar trial conducted with sub clover this year. Sown in pure clover plots in a replicated trial, we will be assessing various varieties for their early vigour and dry matter production throughout the year. We are expecting big things from some new varieties that are included in the trial this year, so make sure to check them out at our Annual Field Day.

> The trusty chemical matrix will be featured again this year. A range of chemicals will be applied over some already established broadleaf pastures to assess their impact on pasture growth and their success in suppressing or killing target weeds. Keep an eye out for some

> Other trials, including species suitability to late sowing, our long term lucerne demonstration and fertiliser trials, will also be taking place throughout the year.
